
MORSE CODE TOWER Tháp Morse Code



NOTE: Basically, the tower is another form of the morse code alphabet chart. If you can remember some basic rules of the tower, you can easily use it to decode a message quickly.

- 1. There are two towers; one start with TÍC and the other start with TÈ.
- 2. Tíc symbolize by the circles and the squares (rectangle) represent Tè.
- 3. With the tower (left side) start with TÍC: if you move horizontal, it would be Tíc and move up would be Tè. These rules apply vice versa with the tower start with TÈ (right side).

TÍC: move horizontal = Tíc & move up = Tè

 $T\grave{E}$: move horizontal = $T\grave{e}$ & move $up = T\acute{u}$

- 4. Each morse tower from the beginning move in all directions no more than 5 units.
- 5. Just remember, hear the sound and follow the tower.

Examples:

- •• (When you hear Tic and next sound is $t \ge that$'s is the letter A)
- •••• (You hear $T\hat{e}$ and the next sound are $T\hat{i}c$ $T\hat{i}c$ = that's the letter B)
- •••• (Same thing, when you hear $T \grave{e} T \acute{c} T \grave{e} T \acute{c} = that \emph{'s the letter C}$)
